Cut paper to size. Using the book you want to cover as a size guideline, measure (or approximate, precision is not super important here) out a rectangular piece of paper slightly larger than the book itself. There should be about two inches of excess at the top and bottom, and about three inches on each side when the book is opened flat.

Put the cover back on, tuck in the remaining flaps, and tape them. Fold the plastic back over the back cover of your book. Then, fold in the top and bottom plastic flaps hanging off the back cover and secure them with tape. Repeat for the front cover.

First, fold the longer edges of your paper over the book's cover so that they sit against it reasonably tight. Then, fold the four corners of the paper in so that they're aligned with the edges of the folds you just made.
