The Constitution of 1780, in contrast, contained a declaration that "all men are born free and equal, and have... the right of enjoying and defending their lives and liberties."

Slavery became recognized as a legal institution in New England years before it was recognized as legal in the South. The first official recognition of chattel slavery came in the Massachusetts Body of Liberties of 1641.
