Women In The Judiciary

By 1993, 60 women had served on the highest court in forty states, the District, and the federal courts. As of 2001, women comprised 26.3% of the judgeships on state courts of last resort, 19.2% of federal district court judgeships, 20.1% of federal appellate judgeships, and as of 2018, 33.3% of the U.S. Supreme Court .

There are currently three women on Supreme Court. In all of American history, only four of 112 Supreme Court Justices have been women. Sixty of 167 active judges sitting on the 13 federal courts of appeal are female; this is about 36% of all sitting judges. Thirty-three percent of US district court judges are women.

Out of the 656 sitting judges in 23 High Courts (barring the High Court of Andhra Pradesh), only 73 are women. This is only 11.12 percent of the number of sitting judges. It is startling to see...
